Dress policy: School dress is primarily the responsibility of the home. We believe that students should dress neatly, respectfully, and modestly. We depend upon the parents to make sure their child is dressed and groomed properly for school but do reserve the right to determine what is appropriate dress. Students are expected to be dressed in an appropriate/respectful manner for a Christian school environment. and clothing shall not be suggestively revealing or send a message contrary to the mission of Faith Christian School. In addition, body adornments must not be disruptive Unacceptable attire includes: spaghetti straps. low cut to the educational process. necklines, shirts that show bare midriffs, clothing that promotes drugs/alcohol, violence, magic, ghosts/spirit world, the occult, or crude jokes. Also unacceptable are low cut pants that show bare midriff, pants/shorts that have holes above the knee, pajama pants, and shorts/skirts/dresses that are too short. (Shorts/skirts/dresses should be mid-thigh or longer.) Undergarments must also be covered, clothing must be clean, and students must be well groomed, as in, students must have their teeth brushed, have clean hair and skin, and wear deodorant when necessary (i.e.: pre-teens and teenagers) Hats must be removed upon entering the building and may not be worn in the classrooms. The administration shall be the final determinant as to the appropriateness of dress.

If a student's attire is deemed inappropriate, they will be asked to remedy the situation or call home for a change of clothing. If the situation cannot be remedied or parents cannot be reached, appropriate clothing will be provided for the day by the school. The clothing will then need to be washed and returned the next day.
